Zoom Conferencing Instructions:

CA Blockchain Working Group is inviting you to a scheduled Zoom meeting.

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Zoom Public Participation Guidelines:

Video: Be mindful of your video feed, any distracting or abusive video content will be turned off by the host.

Muting: All participants will be automatically muted upon entry.

Public Comment: The facilitator will provide time for public comment at the end of each agenda item:

- **Step 1:** write "PUBLIC COMMENT:" in the Zoom chat, so the facilitator can see you have a comment or question. If you want, you can also write out your question in the chat, but that's not required.
- **Step 2:** wait at least 1 minute for the facilitator to see your chat message and call on you to speak.
- Step 3: If the facilitator doesn't acknowledge your question within 2 minutes, you can unmute yourself and say "I have a question". Do not ask your full question yet, since there are often delays in the audio feed that cause people to accidentally talk over each other. Wait for the facilitator to acknowledge your question before you ask it in full.
- Step 4: ask your question.
- Step 5: mute yourself again once you're done discussing with the facilitator.

If you are joining by phone only, wait for the facilitator to prompt for public comment and press *6 to be unmuted and say "I have a question". Do not ask your full question yet, since there are often delays in the audio feed that cause people to accidentally talk over each other. Wait for the facilitator to acknowledge your question before you ask it in full. Once you have asked your question, please mute yourself.
